PROCEEDINGS OF THE EIGHTIETH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION OF OLD REGULAR BAPTIST THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST

FRIDAY

September 8, 1972

The Sardis Association of Old Regular Baptist, The Church of Jesus Christ, assembled with the Turkey Creek Church, Turkey Creek, Pike County, Kentucky on Friday before the second Saturday in September 1972.

As we sang many old time songs in the good old fashioned way that spiritually stirs the soul and fills the heart with love, the many Brethren, Sisters and friends from far and near gathered at the Turkey Creek School House where arrangements had been made for the preaching.

Our capable Moderator, Elder Edwin May, came to the Stand and spoke a few words of welcome to the many Brethren, Sisters, and friends.

Elder Wayne Herald opened the Services about the hour of 10:00 a.m. and was very well blessed to preach for a few minutes of time.

Elder Mitchell Chaffins of the New Salem Association led in prayer.

Elder Isom Hannah preached the Introductory Sermon from his Text: 1st. Timothy 4:16, "Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee." Brother Hannah was blessed to cover his subject.

The Sardis Association Delegates and a large delegation from our corresponding Sister Associations then assembled at the Church where arrangements had been made for the work of our Sardis Association. (11) Called for the Tent Committee to report and, on motion and second, received the following report:

Minutes of Tent Committee Meeting Samaria Church, Marrowbone Creek, Pike Co., Ky. October 23, 1971

Met with Tent Committees of Union Association and New Salem Association for purpose of buying a 1/3 interest and ownership in the Tent now owned equally by these two Associations. Representatives were: UNION ASSOCIATION: Fon Bowling, Bill Brown, Corbet Rose, John M. Mullins and Delbert, Sanders; NEW SALEM ASSOCIATION: Grover Adkins and Amos Newsome; and SARDIS ASSOCIATION: Joe Warrix, Edwin May, Clifford Maynard and Ralph W. E. Varney, Jr. Brother Fon Bowling stood as Moderator.

- (A) Determined that the cost of the tent, trailer and other equipment was \$2800.00 and agreed that a price of \$800.00 would represent a fair price for a full 1/3 interest and ownership since no rental was to be paid for Sardis Association use in 1971.
- (B) The Sardis Association agreed to pay \$100.00 to Union and \$100.00 to New Salem today and pay to the Chairmen listed below the balance of \$600.00 by January 1, 1972, if possible, at \$300.00 to Union and \$300.00 to New Salem.
- (C) Each Tent Committee selected a Chairman who is to be contacted on all matters concerning the tent and he will in turn contact each member of his own Tent Committee: *UNION ASSOCIATION*: John M. Mullins, Rt. 11, Kingsport, Tennessee 37663; *NEW SALEM ASSOCIATION*: Grover Adkins, Fords Branch, Ky. 41501; and *SARDIS ASSOCIATION*: Clifford Maynard, Meta, Ky. 41501.
- (D) The Sardis Association Delegates selected Ralph W. E. Varney, Jr. as Secretary-Treasurer of their Tent Committee.
- (E) John M. Mullins, Union Tent Committee, presented a written Sales Contract for a 1/2 interest and ownership in the tent and equipment to the New Salem Tent Committee for their signature. After reading the Sales Contract and after it was signed by both Union and New Salem Tent Committees, it was agreed the Sardis Association Tent Committee would also sign the Sales Contract and Brother John M. Mullins would prepare an attachment or supplemental contract setting out that Sardis agrees to the same terms, but changing the ownership of the tent and equipment to show a 1/3 interest to each Association—Union, New Salem and Sardis. A copy of both documents to be furnished each Tent Committee.
- (F) Not written into the Contract but agreed to by all three Committees are the following:

- (i) Two Brethren, Bill Brown, Route 1, Box 10, Jenkins, Ky. and Corbet Rose, Box 154, Pound, Va., will be responsible for the tent from the time it leaves the storage point at Brother Amos Newsome's and will: (1) Approve the truck or other means of transporting the tent and trailer; (2) come to the proposed tent site well in advance of the time set to erect the tent and direct grounds preparation; (3) supervise and direct the erection, care and taking down of the tent; and (4) supervise all repair, cleaning, treatment, etc. of the tent.
- (ii) The Association using the tent will: (1) pay Brother Bill and Brother Corbet for their services; (2) furnish all necessary labor to handle setting up and taking down of the tent; (3) provide the means of transporting the tent from its storage site to the place it is to be used and return to its storage place; and (4) provide 24 hour watchman or protection for the tent, trailer and equipment while it is in use.
- (G) Sardis Tent Committee agreed to advise the Churches in our Association using the tent to get insurance to cover liability (personal and property), and vandalism not covered by insurance already provided or to be provided by the three Tent Committees.
- (H) It was agreed that all repair, insurance, care, etc. necessary for the tent, trailer and equipment would be paid for equally by the three Tent Committees.
- (12) Called for Tent Committee Treasurer to report and, upon motion and second, received the following report:

(13) On motion and second appointed a Tent Committee as follows:

Elder Clifford Maynard, Chairman Brother Ralph W. E. Varney, Jr., Secretary-Treasurer Elder Edwin May Brother Joe Warrix Brother James M. Ray

- (14) On motion and second it is ordered that Sardis Association Tent Committee meet with the other Tent Committees to negotiate sale of interest in the tent to Northern New Salem Association.
- (15) All three Delegates from the Sardis Church agreed to take back their request to drop Elk Fork Church from fellowship for having members belonging to Secret Orders, after being advised the Sisters involved had gotten their Letters and were no longer members of the Elk Fork Church.
- (16) Request from Bethany Church to drop Elk Fork Church from fellowship for having members belonging to Secret Orders met with a move and second to send the request back to the Bethany Church. Objection was filed by Elder Ellis Davis. Motion was passed by 57 to 8 vote of the Delegates.
- (17) Request from Bethany Church to drop Salem Church and Turkey Creek Church from fellowship because they violated the Secret Order rule of the Association by allowing Elder Charlie Johnson to serve them as Moderator while he belongs to Secret Orders was taken back by all three Delegates from Bethany Church, after Elder Charlie Johnson stated he would resign as Moderator of Salem Church and Turkey Creek Church at their next meeting time in order to bring about peace in the Sardis Association.
- (18) Brother Jim Bevins moved to drop Item 11 of our 1962 minute concerning Secret Orders. Second by Brother Calvin Bevins. The Moderator, Elder Edwin May, determined this move and second to be out of order. By vote of 61 to 0 the Delegates upheld the Moderator and determined the move out of order.
- (19) A request from Sardis Church to reprint Item 10 of our 1964 Minute concerning Secret Orders met with a move by Brother Uley Perry and second by Brother Tommy Smith to return the request to them.
- (20) Request from Elk Fork Church to stop Bethany Church from sending Committees and causing disturbance and confusion was withdrawn by all three Delegates from Elk Fork Church.

- (21) Request from Okeechobee Church to publish Elders Dorsey Halland and Earl W. Clay in disorder and remove their names from the list of ordained ministers, for taking their membership to a Church not in fellowship with Sardis Association, was granted by motion and second. Therefore, Dorsey Halland and Earl W. Clay are not preaching under the patronage of the Okeechobee Church nor of the Sardis Association.
- (22) The Association by regular move and second said that if a Sister has cut her hair, she should be asked to let it grow out; if she fails to do so, and cuts her hair again, she will be excluded.
- (23) By motion and second, it is ordered that we advise our ministers of our Association not to marry people into adultry, where either man or woman has a living wife or husband.
- (24) In answer to the question, "Shall we receive into our fellow-ship men or women having more than one wife or husband?" The Association by regular move and second said, "We advise the Churches not to receive into their fellowship any such, except those who have put away their companion for the cause of fornication, such cases to have Gospel or Church evidence of same."
- (25) By motion and second it is ordered that request for Union, Communion and Memorial Meetings be published in our Minute.
- (26) By motion and second it is ordered that Obituaries of our deceased Brothers and Sisters that are in good standing with the Church at the time of death be printed in our Minutes. These are to be presented to the Clerk at the end of the Association.
- (27) Brethren called in Union, Communion, Memorial Meetings and Associations last year made their reports which were received and their failures excused.
- (28) A request for the 1973 Sardis Association was received from the Dix Fork Church and Rebecca Church. By motion and second it is ordered that our next Association Meeting be held with the Rebecca Church beginning on Friday before the second Saturday in September 1973. The Rebecca Church is located near Belo, W. Va. Take Route 52 from Williamson, W. Va. to Naugatuck, W. Va. and then take Route 65 to Belo, W. Va. Turn left at Belo and go up Trace Fork of Pigeon Creek to end of new 4-lane road. Then take Old Road to Church—about 10 miles. Signs will be at Belo and end of 4-lane road.
- (29) By motion and second it is ordered that the Sardis Association request all of our Churches, who can and want to, to send help to the Church who will host our next Association, The Rebecca Church.

CIRCULAR LETTER

Dearly Beloved Brethren of the Sardis Association:

Being chosen last year to prepare the circular letter for 1972, I have devoted much time to prayer and meditation, desiring God's divine guidance that this letter may meet the approval of the brethren and also be approved of Him.

I have chosen to use Romans 6:23 for my subject: "the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." According to the scriptures it is adult people who have transgressed God's laws that are called sinners, and are dead while they live. In order for them to receive the gift of God, or eternal life, they must be borned again. They must repent and die dead to the love of sin and be made alive in Jesus Christ.

Eph. 2:8 says, "By grace are ye saved through faith and its not of yourselves it is the gift of God." So the gift of God is eternal life through Christ who offered His body up on the tree of the cross to make it possible unto all men upon the terms of the gospel. John 3:16 says, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believeth on him should not perish, but have everlasting (or eternal) life." So we see that eternal life is in Jesus. In order to receive it we must go to Jesus in faith believing. For the scriptures say in Acts 4:12, "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." So we must seek the Lord while He may be found and call upon Him while He is near, for He willith not in the death of any, but would that all men come to repentance, and receive the gift of God or eternal life.

Heb. 11:6 says they that come to God must believe that He is and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him, for without faith it's impossible to please Him. Romans 10:8 and 9 says, "The word is nigh thee, even in thy mouth, and in thy heart: that is, the word of faith, which we preach; that if thou will confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved."

For by grace are ye saved through faith; and it's not of yourselves: it's the gift of God. We see the grace of God as an unmerited, or undeserved, or unearned gift that God made possible to mankind through the death of His only begotten son on the cross. And the scriptures teach that this same grace has appeared unto all men, and they are free to accept it upon the terms of the gospel or otherwise they can reject it. But to the dead sinner that Jesus spoke of in St. John 5:25, "Verily, verily, I say unto you, the hour is coming, and now is, when

the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God: and they that hear shall live." According to the scriptures, sinners are called and begotten by the word of God, and commanded to cleanse your hand ye sinner, purify your heart ye doubleminded.

A sinner must quit his sinning before he can call upon God with an honest heart. Then, when the sinner becomes honest and sincere, he begins a travel from nature to grace. According to the scriptures, it is a way of mourning, of sorrow, and death at the end of that travel; how long or how short it may be depends on the individual—how humble and sincere he is. Then there is a birth. And the sorrow and anguish is forgotten for joy. So this is when God speaks peace to that soul, borns it again of an uncorruptable seed which liveth and abideth forever, and receives eternal life—the gift of God—in the soul. And from that time on is delivered and saved and will finally persevere through grace to glory, and shall never fall away or be lost.

So now we see we don't wait until death to receive eternal life in the soul. But in order for both soul and body to receive eternal life the body has to have a change from a natural to a spiritual. So I believe there is some knowledge of salvation as the scriptures teach. We know we've passed from death unto life because we love the brethren. I John 5:13, "These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know ye have eternal life." All these things make us feel we are the children of God and heirs of God, and joint heirs with Jesus Christ, and that our inheritance and treasures are in heaven.

Eph. 2:10 says we are God's "workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God before hath ordained that we should walk in them." So we see salvation will produce good works, but not works for salvation.

All the things above mentioned take place before water baptism, for water baptism alone cannot and will not save any one but the same spirit that we receive in the new birth will prompt us to desire it and to be willing to be buried with Christ in baptism—not putting away the filth of the flesh, but answering that good conscience, that only a borned again Christian can manifest. Seeing we have put off the old man with his evil deeds and have put on the new man which is Christ Jesus who promised never to leave us or forsake us, but will be with us through the sixth trouble and forsake us not in the seventh.

So, Brethren, in closing this letter, let us pray to God to keep us humble and sincere and always be ready to give the reason of the hope that is within us. Pray that His peace will abound that we may live peaceably as much as possible with all men; that our lives may give

off the rays of light that might reach the path of some sinner; and that they may see our good works and glorify the Father. So, Brethren, farewell, hoping this letter will be accepted to be printed in the minutes.



CONSTITUTION OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experiences we, the OLD REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST, being baptized upon a profession of faith in Christ are convinced of the necessity of a combination of Churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion among us and to keep the order and rules of an Association according to the following plan of government.

ARTICLE 1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different Churches in our union and sent to represent them in the Association and, upon their producing Letters from their respective Churches certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat.

ARTICLE 2. In the Letters shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those baptized, received by Letter, dismissed, excluded, and deceased since our last Association.

ARTICLE 3. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord anything over God's heritage nor shall they have any clerical power over the Churches nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any Church in the union.

ARTICLE 4. The Association when convened shall be ruled by a regular and proper decorum.

ARTICLE 5. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk, each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.

ARTICLE 6. New Churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by Letter and delegates and, if found upon examination to be orthodox and orderly, shall be received; and every Church in the union shall be entitled to a representative in the Association.

ARTICLE 7. Every query presented by the Church to the Association, being first debated in their own Churches, shall be taken up by the Association.

ARTICLE 8. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except when withdrawn by the one who made it.

ARTICLE 9. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the Church with

Minutes of the Association.

ARTICLE 10. We think it necessary that we should have an Association fund for defraying expenses of the same. We think it the duty of each Church in the union to contribute such sums as they think proper and to send it by their delegates to the Association; and such sums be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer chosen by the Association who shall be accountable for the money paid him by the Association, and paid out according to the Association.

ARTICLE 11. There shall be an Association book kept wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be recorded by a Secretary appointed by the Association who shall receive a compensation for his services.

ARTICLE 12. The minutes of the Association shall be read, and corrected if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises, unless the same is dispensed with.

ARTICLE 13. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made by a majority of the union, if deemed necessary.

ARTICLE 14. All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by will of a majority of the delegates present.

ARTICLE 15. The Association shall have the power for the general union of the Churches; to preserve inviolable a chain of communion among the Churches; to give Churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; to inquire into the cause of the Churches failing to represent themselves at any time in the Association; to appropriate the money contributed by the Churches for the Association fund to any purpose they may think proper; to appoint any member, by their consent, to transact any business which they see necessary; and they shall have power to withdraw from any Church in the union which violates the rules of the Association or deviate from the orthodox principles of religion; and to admit any orderly Minister of our order to a seat with us. The Association shall have the right to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think most convenient to the Churches.

ARTICLES OF FAITH OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE 1. We believe in only one true and living God, the Father, the Son, and Holy Ghost: and these three are one, equal in power, essence and glory.

ARTICLE 2. We believe the Scripture of the Old and New Testaments are the written words of God and the only rules of faith and practice.

ARTICLE 3. We believe in the doctrine of election by grace, for by grace are ye saved through faith.

ARTICLE 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin and of man's inability to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature, therefore the Saviour is needed for our redemption.

ARTICLE 5. We believe that sinners are called to repentance and believe in the Gospel and regeneration of the soul and sealed with Holy Spirit of promise, and none shall fall away and be lost.

ARTICLE 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.

ARTICLE 7. We believe that baptism is the ordinance of God's Church on earth and the mode of IMMERSION, back foremost, so as to cover all over.

ARTICLE 8. We believe that the Lord's Supper is the command of the Saviour, and that by the use of bread and the fruit of the vine; and feet washing should be kept up until His second coming by His believers.

ARTICLE 9. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and

ARTICLE 9. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal.

ARTICLE 10. We believe that no Minister has the right to administer the ordinances and commands of the Gospel except such as regularly ordained and baptized, and that by immersion by a legal administrator of the Gospel comes under the hands of a regularly chosen presbytery of the Church.

ARTICLE 11. We believe it to be the duty of all Church members to contribute for defraying all reasonable expenses of the Church, never forgetting the poor according to their several abilities.

ARTICLE 12. We believe that every doctrine that goes to encourage or indulge people in their sins or cause them to settle down on anything short of saving faith in Christ for salvation is erroneous, and such doctrine will be rejected by us.

ARTICLE 13. We believe that the Church of Christ is a congregation of faithful believers in Christ who have obtained fellowship with the Lord and one another, and have given themselves to the Lord and have agreed to keep up a Godly discipline according to the rules of the Gospel.

ARTICLE 14. We believe that Jesus Christ is the Head of the Church and the government thereof is upon His shoulders.

ARTICLE 15. None of the above Articles shall be considered as to hold with particular election and reprobation so as to make God partial, directly or indirectly, nor to injure any of the children of men; nor shall any of these Articles be altered without legal notice and free consent.

RULES OF DECORUM

ARTICLE 1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

ARTICLE 2. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.

ARTICLE 3. Only one member shall speak at a time who shall arise from his seat and obtain consent from the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.

ARTICLE 4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone except the Moderator until he is through.

ARTICLE 5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who has spoken so as to make remarks on his slips or imperfections, but shall fairly state the cause as nearly as he can so as to convey his ideas.

ARTICLE 6. No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association without leave of the Association.

ARTICLE 7. No person shall speak more than three times on any subject without leave of the Association; and only five minutes at a time.

ARTICLE 8. No person shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same nor whisper in time of public speech.

ARTICLE 9. No member of the Association shall address another in any other term of appellation than that of "Brother."

ARTICLE 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt or prohibit any member from speaking until he gives his light on any subject unless he violates the Rules of Decorum.

ARTICLE 11. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called as often as the Association requires.

ARTICLE 12. The Moderator shall have the same right of speech as any other member, provided the chair be filled; and he shall have no right to vote unless the Association be equally divided, then he may give the deciding vote.

ARTICLE 13. Any member who shall willingly and knowingly violate any of the Decorum shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.
