# PROCEEDINGS of the ONE HUNDRED AND TWELFTH ANNUAL SESSION of the SARDIS ASSOCIATION OF OLD REGULAR BAPTIST

#### FRIDAY September 10, 2004

THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST

The Sardis Association of Old Regular Baptist, the Church of Jesus Christ, assembled in the Business Room of the Sardis Association Building at 180 Brushy School Road, Varney, Pike County, Kentucky, with our host, the Little Rosie Church, on Friday before the second Saturday in September, 2004.

About the hour of 9:00 a.m. our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the Stand and welcomed the congregation. Brother Tommy stated that he loves this old Association. He said, "seeing everyone come in caused him to shed tears." It is time we come together. I believe God put a love in us and we need to let it shine. This is not a battleground; this is a worship service. The government of this Church is not on Brother Tommy's shoulders, it is on God's shoulders. Pray for our Brothers.

Elder Bobby Scott, Sr. came in the opening, having been chosen last year as alternate for this years Introductory Sermoan. He said, I am looking for a better meeting than this. He sang, "I'll Never Walk Through The Valley." Brother Bobby quoted, "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. Thou prepartest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever."

He said he believes man has something to do. Brother Bobby was wonderfully blessed to warn sinner men and women that they needed to die dead to the love of sin and come to Jesus Christ. There is plenty in the storehouse if we will humble ourselves. By the grace of God, I am what I am. I heard about a land called Heaven and I have started to make Heaven my home. He said, I will put my spirit in you and when he does you will know God has performed it. Jesus said, it is expedient that I go away for if I go not away the comforter will not come unto you; but if I depart I will send him unto you. When we enter that city we will get a full meal.

There will be shouting in that city. Awake from your sleep and call upon the Lord. The Lord heard my cry and set my feet upon the Rock. He is my shelter in the time of storm. Who knoweth that he receive the little white stone, except he that receive it. Today is the day of salvation, harden not your heart as they did in the days of provocation. He said he thought of John baptizing in the river of Jordan, he looked up and saw somebody coming. Behold the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world. John looked for a sign. John felt so little. I feel so little today. John said to Jesus,"I have need to be baptized of thee, and cometh thou to me." Jesus answered and said unto him, "suffer it to be so now: for thus it becometh us to fulfill all righteousness." Brother Richard said if you are filled with the spirit you will desire to be baptized.; to be washed in the newness of life. I love to feel him, Brothers. If you have God, you can feel him.

I want to go to a land where the air is pure and real. Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him. Dials, our Moderator, called to seats the delegates from our Churches sent to represent them in this Association and the delegates sent by our Corresponding Sister Associations.

Brother Tommy called upon Elder Bill Blevins, of the Northern New Salem Association, to open the Service. Brother Bill sang, "God On The Mountain." He asked that everyone pray that God will bless him. He said it takes God in all things. God does things at the right time. You will know when God comes in your life. I was raised in a newness of life. Jesus came into my life. If you don't know God in the pardon and remission of your sins, now is the time. He is the best thing that ever happened to this world. He came to seek and to save. He said, come and taste of me for I am good. "Look unto me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth: for I am God, and there is none else." He is my shelter. Brother Bill then led in prayer.

The Sardis Association then proceeded as follows:

He seated the Delegates and called this, the One Hundred and Twelfth Session of the Sardis Association, to order. He stated that some of us have left home not knowing what we will return to. - (6) The Moderator appointed a Committee to arrange the preaching for Friday night and Saturday consisting of one delegate from each Church in the Sardis Association, and the entire delegation from the host church.
- (7) The Moderator appointed the following Committee of Tellers to take the vote of the Sardis Association delegates for Officers to serve the Sardis Association for the coming year and instructed the delegates to vote for a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk:

- (14) The Moderator called for newly organized Churches or other Churches of our same faith and order desiring to take up correspondence with the Sardis Association, and for Associations desiring to take up correspondence with the Sardis Association and none responded.
- (15) The Moderator appointed a Committee on Arrangements consisting of one delegate from each Church and all the Officers of the Sardis Association, along with the entire delegation from each of our Corresponding Sister Associations, to arrange the business for Saturday's session of the Sardis Association. By regular move and second, this Committee will meet at 2:00 p.m. today.
- (16) On motion from Elder Charles Jarrell, second by Elder Dewey Blackburn, the Sardis Association was adjourned until 9:00 a.m. Saturday morning, September 11, 2004.

#### SATURDAY September 11, 2004

Met pursuant to adjournment at the Sardis Association Building where, about the hour of 9:00 a.m., our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the stand and said, whatever you are doing keep doing it. I feel you have been praying. The attitude you bring in determines how things are going to go. The spirit was so strong last night. We want to continue that same spirit. We want to continue that same love. The devil is right among us. Let's push him to the back of the house. He then called upon Elder Estill Hamilton, of the Union Association, to open these services.

Brother Estill said he come for one thing; to worship God in the spirit and truth. If we come for any other reason, we come for the wrong purpose. He said, I would you like to be like Sampson when he took a little honey from the carcass. Look up to God for everything and let him guide us. When troubles come look to God. Jesus spoke to the winds and the sea and they obeyed him. The Lord can lift you up. I came thinking of Jesus Christ and him crucified. You should stay awake at night talking to God. God is the one our help comes from. We are going to a land where there is joy, joy, joy. I want to go to that land and see Jesus. The little woman had an issue of blood. She said, if I could only touch the hem of his garment I would be made whole. When I got down as low as I could go and touched the hem of his garment I was made whole.

When God cleans a man up he is made whole. The Lord has got all things in his hand. Jesus Christ is sweet today. He comforts me and my cup runs over. Brother Estill led in prayer.

The Sardis Association then proceeded as follows:

- (1) Called the roll of delegates and marked the absentees. At this time the Moderator released the Brethren, Sisters and friends to assemble in the Preaching room.
- (2) Read the Bill of Arrangements and, by move and second, received the report and discharged the Committee on Arrangements.
- (3) The Committee, appointed in Item 4 of our 2003 Minutes, reported that they had gone to the Elk Fork Church on November 15, 2003 with the authority of asking the Elk Fork Church if they wanted to remain in the Association and to remove any element that may prevent this from happening.

During the New Business of their meeting the Moderator, Elder Joe Evans, asked the Clerk to read a motion and second that had been made in their meeting in September, 2003. The motion and second by members of the Elk Fork Church, with no objection, was that the Elk Fork Church was withdrawing from the Sardis Association.

Therefore, this committee had no reason to be seated by the Elk Fork Church since the Elk Fork Church had answered the question through their motion and second. This committee respectfully departed being satisfied that the Elk Fork Church no longer wanted to be a part of the Sardis Association.

By regular move and second the report was received and the committee discharged.

- (4) The Moderator called for the report from the Little Rosie Church concerning cost for showers for the campers as called for in Item 7 of the 2003 Minutes. No report was given. On regular move and second the Little Rosie Church was given another year to make the report.
- (5) Read a Request from the Turkey Creek Church asking the Association to remove the ordinance in our Minute stating that the view of a sanctioned marriage of God is between an man and woman only. The Turkey Creek Church requests the Association adopt the following and add it to the Articles of Faith as an additional Item: "We believe that a sanctioned marriage of God is between a man and a woman only.

Also, we believe in receiving members into our fellowship that follow the natural dating relationship that leads to holy matrimony between a man and a woman only: thereby, preserving the family unit of father, mother and children. Ephesians 5:22,23 and 28, St. Mark 10:6,7 and 8, and Romans 1:26 and 27.

By regular move and second the Request was granted and it is ordered that Item 12 of 2003 Minutes be removed and add the above to the Articles of Faith as Article 15 and renumber what was Article 15 in the 2003 Minutes to be Article 16 in the 2004 Minutes.

(6) Read a Request from the Salem Church asking the Sardis Association to permit, authorize and establish the housing and perpetual maintenance of a "Sardis Association of Old Regular Baptist Historical Library" at the Pikeville-Pike County Public Library to receive, house and store in a "Private Collection" section of the Library, not accessible to the general public, at least two original copies of our Sardis Association Minute Books from the year 1893 and upward. This would include any related historical documents or old and current photographs. Also, if the request is granted, appoint a committee to gather and preserve what is still available of our history.

#### STANDING ITEMS

Item 1. Item 14 of our 1975 Minutes is reprinted, without the preamble, as follows:

Sardis Association of Old Regular Baptist September 13, 1975 Dingess, West Virginia

Brethren:

In answer to the Query from the Dix Fork Church asking, "Does the Sardis Association believe in Sisters wearing pants, slacks or shorts?" We, as an Advisory body, say:

To answer this query in the affirmative would be interpreted by some Brethren too liberally and they would say we have laid down the gate and opened the doors to anything and everything.

To answer this Query in the negative would be interpreted by some Brethren too strictly and they would say we have shut the door on everything and Committees would flow from Church to Church like water. We believe the Sardis Association should advise the Churches to advise their members, both Brethren and Sisters, to dress soberly and modestly and to conduct themselves in a manner that becometh a Child of God. We believe that each Child of God will adorn themselves in a manner that they can easily be identified from the world. We feel the Bible, the infallible Word of God, sets forth and the Spirit will teach us how we should dress and conduct ourselves.

We believe, and the Association has so stated in the past, that each Church in the Sardis Association holds the key to its own door and is the sole judge of the conduct of its members as long as they follow the orthodox principles of religion and keep up a Godly discipline according to the rules of the Gospel as laid down in the Scriptures. In fact, Article 3 of our Constitution guarantees that the Association shall not infringe on any internal right of the Churches.

- Item 2. The Association, by regular move and second, said that if a Sister has cut her hair, she should be asked to let it grow out; if she fails to do so and cuts her hair again, she will be excluded.
- Item 3. It is ordered that we advise our Ministers of our Churches not to marry anyone having a living husband or wife unless they bring scripture evidence for putting their husband or wife away. (1929 minute)
- Item 4. It is ordered that we advise our Churches not to allow their Ministers to preach with any Minister who has two living women. (1919 minute)
- Item 5. It is ordered that requests for Union, Communion and Memorial meetings be published in our Minutes.

Item 6. By motion and second, it is ordered that Obituaries of our deceased Brethren and Sisters that are in good standing with the Churches at the time of death be printed in our Minutes. Also, friends of the Churches that are recommended by the Churches be printed in a separate section of our minute. These are to be presented to the Clerk at the end of the Association. A charge of \$15.00 will be made for a picture with the obituary, except that pictures of an Elder or his wife will continue to be printed free.

Clerks Note: Please note the above order - it is incumbent upon the churches in the Sardis Association that they be the screen and recommending body of Obituaries of Friends to be printed in our minutes and identify the same (by note or otherwise) to the Clerks when the Obituary is turned in. Each Church Moderator is further required to screen and approve any Obituary of a Friend of the Church and to reject any Obituary that has language that is offensive to the Sardis Association.

Item 7. "We the Sardis Association, advise our Sister Churches that it is not our practice to use sisters or double-married men in any function of the ministry, including leading prayer, in any of our Church services."

Item 8. By regular move and second, it is ordered that Item (15) of our 1999 Minute be reprinted as follows:

"It is a sin for anyone to put away their wife or husband for any cause except for fornication and marry another. In regards to going behind one's experience or receiving one in the Church with more than one living companion, we say that each Church shall be the sole judge to the validity of one's experience. Churches should not be forced to receive members, however, that would destroy the body. (Receive should be interpreted to include all means of receiving members.)"

If you are going through life without God, you are not fighting the fight God wants you to fight. I try to read every day. As I try to read my mind goes to the problems.

When John was out there and in his troubles on the Isle of Patmos, being all alone he saw a new heaven and a new earth because the first heaven and earth had passed away. God told them there would be a new heaven and earth because heaven and earth had passed away. Everything became new to me when God came into my life and wiped the tears away. He gave life. I was crying for mercy. I got as low as I could get down. God said, son you are freely forgiven. He will take this natural life and there will be no more troubles. God told John, I will show you the Holy City, New Jerusalem. He told Israel to get up and raise you hand. Rise up, ye daughter of Zion, rise up and shine.

Jesus is coming back. He said I am going away but I am coming back. I am going back to where my father is at. I am glad he went away, glad he died and opened up the fountain. God came down and told Ezekiel he would put in a new heart, new spirit and make everything new. He was talking about this land that flows with milk and honey when he was talking about this Holy City, New Jerusalem. Like a crane did I chatter, like a dove did I mourn.

That rock is Jesus Christ. The man on the inside is a perfect man. The man on the outside is not. On that day the outward man is going to change. The inward man has already been changed. The Church is going up to meet Jesus in the air. If you have experienced a birth, come on up and tell the brothers while we sing this song.


### WILLIS STATON




### **BASIL GILLMAN**

### CONSTITUTION OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experiences we, the OLD REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST, being baptized upon a profession of faith in Christ are convinced of the necessity of a combination of Churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion among us and to keep the order and rules of an Association according to the following plan of government.

- **ARTICLE 1.** The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different Churches in our union and sent to represent them in the Association and, upon their producing Letters from their respective Churches certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat.
- ARTICLE 2. In the Letters shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those baptized, received by Letter, dismissed, excluded, and deceased since our last Association.
- ARTICLE 3. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord anything over God's heritage nor shall they have any clerical power over the Churches nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any Church in the Union.
- ARTICLE 4. The Association when convened shall be ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- ARTICLE 5. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.
- **ARTICLE 6.** New Churches may be admitted to this union who shall petition by Letter and delegates and, if found upon examination to be orthodox and orderly, shall be received; and every Church in the union shall be entitled to a representative in the Association.
- ARTICLE 7. Every query presented by the Church to the Association, being first debated in their own Churches, shall be taken up by the Association.
- ARTICLE 8. Every motion made and seconded shall come under consideration of the Association, except when withdrawn by the one who made it.
- ARTICLE 9. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the Churches with Minutes of the Association.
- ARTICLE 10. We think it necessary that we should have an Association Fund for defraying the expenses of the same. We think it the duty of each Church in the union to contribute such sums as they think proper and to send it by their delegates to the Association; and such sums be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer chosen by the Association who shall be accountable for the money paid him by the Association, and paid out according to the Association.
- ARTICLE 11. There shall be an Association book kept wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be recorded by a Secretary appointed by the Association who shall receive a compensation for his services.
- ARTICLE 12. The minutes of the Association shall be read, and corrected if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises, unless the same is dispensed with.
- ARTICLE 13. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made by a majority of the union, if deemed necessary.
- ARTICLE 14. All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by the will of the majority of the delegates present.

ARTICLE 15. The Association shall have the power to provide for the general union of the Churches; to preserve inviolable a chain of communion among the Churches; to give Churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; to inquire into the cause of the Churches failing to represent themselves at any time in the Association; to appropriate the money contributed by the Churches for the Association fund to any purpose they may think proper; to appoint any member, by their consent, to transact any business which they see necessary; and they shall have the power to withdraw from any Church in the union which violates the rules of the Association or deviate from the orthodox principles of religion; and to admit any orderly Minister of our order to seat with us. The Association shall have the right to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think most convenient to the Churches.

### ARTICLES OF FAITH OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

- ARTICLE 1. We believe in only one true and living God; the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost; and these three are one, equal in power, essence and glory.
- ARTICLE 2. We believe the scripture of the Old and New Testaments of the Authorized King James Version of the Bible are the written words of God and are the only rules of faith and practice.
- ARTICLE 3. We believe in the doctrine of election by grace, for by grace are ye saved through faith.
- ARTICLE 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin and of man's inability to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature, therefore the Saviour is needed for our redemption.
- ARTICLE 5. We believe that sinners are called to repentance and believe in the Gospel and regeneration of the soul and sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, and none shall fall away and be lost.
- ARTICLE 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.
- **ARTICLE 7.** We believe that baptism is the ordinance of God's Church on earth and the mode IMMERSION, back foremost, so as to cover all over.
- ARTICLE 8. We believe that the Lord's Supper is the command of the Saviour, and that by use of bread and the fruit of the vine, and feet washing should be kept up until his second coming by his believers.
- ARTICLE 9. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal.
- ARTICLE 10. We believe that no Minister has the right to administer the ordinances and commands of the Gospel except such as are regularly ordained and baptized, and that by immersion by a legal administrator of the Gospel comes under the hands of a regularly chosen presbytery of the Church.
- ARTICLE 11. We believe it to be the duty of all Church members to contribute for defraying all reasonable expenses of the Church, never forgetting the poor according to their several abilities.
- ARTICLE 12. We believe that every doctrine that goes to encourage or indulge people in their sins or cause them to settle down on anything short of saving faith in Christ for salvation is erroneous, and such doctrine shall be rejected by us.
- ARTICLE 13. We believe that the Church of Jesus Christ is a congregation of faithful believers in Christ who have obtained fellowship with the Lord and one another, and have given themselves to the Lord and have agreed to keep up a Godly discipline according to the rules of the Gospel.
- ARTICLE 14. We believe that Jesus Christ is the head of the Church and the government thereof is upon His Shoulders.

- ARTICLE 15. We believe that a sanctioned marriage of God is between a man and a woman only. Also, we believe in receiving members into our fellowship that follow the natural dating relationship that leads to holy matrimony between a man and a woman only: thereby, preserving the family unit of father, mother and children. Ephesians 5:22,23 and 28, St. Mark 10:6,7,8 and Romans 1:26 and 27.
- ARTICLE 16. None of the above Articles shall be considered as to hold with particular election and reprobation so as to make God partial, directly or indirectly, nor to injure any of the children of men, nor shall any of those Articles be altered without legal notice and free consent.

### RULES OF DECORUM OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

- ARTICLE 1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- **ARTICLE 2.** The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.
- ARTICLE 3. Only one member shall speak at a time who shall arise from his seat and obtain consent from the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.
- **ARTICLE 4.** The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone except the Moderator until he is through.
- ARTICLE 5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who has spoken so as make remarks on his slips or imperfections, but shall fairly state the cause as nearly as he can so as to convey his ideas.
- ARTICLE 6. No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association without leave of the Association.
- ARTICLE 7. No person shall speak more than three times on any subject without leave of the Association, and only five minutes at a time.
- ARTICLE 8. No person shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same nor whisper in time of public speech.
- ARTICLE 9. No member of the Association shall address another in any other term or appellation than that of "brother."
- ARTICLE 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt or prohibit any member from speaking until he gives his light on any subject unless he violates the Rules of Decorum.
- ARTICLE 11. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called as often as the Association requires.
- ARTICLE 12. The Moderator shall have the same right of speech as any other member, provided the chair be filled; and he shall have no right to vote unless the Association be equally divided, then he may give the deciding vote.
- ARTICLE 13. Any member who shall willingly and knowingly violate any of the Decorum shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.
