SARDIS ASSOCIATION

OF

OLD REGULAR BAPTIST THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST

FRIDAY September 8, 2006

The Sardis Association of Old Regular Baptist, the Church of Jesus Christ, assembled in the Business Room of the Sardis Association Building at 180 Brushy School Road, Varney, Pike County, Kentucky, with our host, the Pilgrims Home Church, on Friday before the second Saturday in September, 2006.

About the hour of 9:00 a.m. our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the Stand and welcomed the congregation. Brother Tom stated that we had such a good meeting Thursday night and that it is all about love. He stated the need to pay attention to our brothers. We need our correspondence. We need your prayers and your love. We want to continue that love. The meeting yesterday evening was wonderful. We want to continue that. You need to put a little effort into this. We welcome you and want to serve you. Let us continue this Association in love.

Elder Frankie Scott, having been chosen as alternate for this session's Introductory Sermon, came to the stand to preach the opening of the service. He asked everyone to pray. He sang, "Six Hours On The Cross." He stated that he comes in much weakness, fear and trembling and that in order to preach he must be blessed by God. He said, when he feels the blessings of God, he feels true peace down in his soul. It is a great blessing to be assembled together. He requested that everyone pray. The prayers of the righteous availeth much. When God blesses me only then am I able to preach. I want to press onward bearing the cross of Jesus. When God says it is finished, go down and bring my children home, then we will be together. God has an appointed time set. In the morning the grave is not going to hold these bodies down. It is sown in corruption; it is raised in incorruption: it is sown in dishonour; it is raised in glory: it is sown in weakness; it is raised in power. When I awake in his likeness, I'll be satisfied. I am looking forward to the time I can set down at Jerusalem's table with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. When Stephen was stoned, God blessed him. He Said "I see Jesus." I thank God he is called the father of this old family. Brother Frankie then led in prayer.

Elder Lacy Walters came to the stand to preach the Introductory Sermon hoping to get in touch with the great I am. He sang, "A Vision of Heaven." He stated he wanted to live again. He said everyone wants to live again. You must have a birth in Christ Jesus to get to Heaven. He said he wants to say something that would make someone call upon Jesus. Jesus is coming back after the Church. The Church is everyone who has had their robe washed white in the blood of the Lamb. We are going away forever. If you don't want to sing and shout, you don't want to go to Heaven. When it comes your time you will answer that sound. You won't have no excuse in that day. Heaven is real and that lake of fire is real. Everyone is going to live again; over in Heaven or in the lake of fire. In the morning you will get a body that will never die again.

The rich man cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue, for I am tormented in this flame. Death and hell will deliver up the dead that are in them and they will be judged every man according to their works. And death and hell will be cast into the lake of fire.

This man here is waiting on a change. The Lord will come back after us. When I get down in the valley, Jesus is there. He will take care of us. The Spirit of the Lord is better felt than told. When the Spirit gets upon you, you can say something. He said that one morning he would be getting on top of the mountain and will not be coming back. Don't let satan blind you, you can go down to the world of the lost. You must be born again. It takes a new birth in Christ Jesus. It gets sweeter all the time. "Be ye ready for ye know not the hour." He further preached, "I believe we are kept by the power of God." When the Lord saved him he could hear things different, the birds even sounded different. Brother Lacy said he wished his children would call upon the Lord while they have got life. I hope they do. If I could just be the cause of one saying, "Oh God have mercy on me." We make mistakes, we are not perfect. Greater is he that is within you, than he that is in the world. I love you and want to meet you over in Heaven. Live close together. Jesus loves you the most. "Be ye ready for ye know not the hour." I hope to meet you over in Heaven's land.

The Sardis Association delegates and a large delegation from our Corresponding Sister Associations remained in the Business Room for the Work of this Association and, as is our custom, the many non-delegate Brethren, Sisters and friends were dismissed to assemble in the Preaching Room to hear the preaching of:

The delegates having assembled themselves in order, Elder Thomas J. Dials, our Moderator, called to seats the delegates from our Churches sent to represent them in this Association and the delegates sent by our Corresponding Sister Associations.

Brother Tommy called upon Elder Ellis Holbrook, of the New Salem Association, to open the Service.

Brother Ellis came forward stating he hardly knew what to say. He had been thinking back to when he was about twenty years old. He was in North Korea and a movie had been set up for them to watch. The name of the movie was three little words. At the end of the movie the title appeared on the screen:" I Love You." We have heard the word love used a lot this morning. I hope love will flow. God is Love. A long time ago, two thousdand years, more or less, God took notice of his people. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." We feel and believe that Jesus is Christ, begotten of God and the son of God. Jesus came down upon this earth and took a body of flesh. Born a little babe, but King of kings. Even when the wise men came and he was a little baby, they worshipped him. Repentance is required at the hands of all men. I am here to assemble with my brothers and sisters in love. God sent his servant, John, who came preaching in the wilderness, "repent ye for the kingdom of Heaven is at hand." When John was baptizing down in the river of Jordan he saw Jesus coming toward him he said, "behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world." Jesus said, "John I came here today for you to baptize me. It is so to fulfill all righteousness."

SATURDAY September 9, 2006

Met pursuant to adjournment at the Sardis Association Building where, about the hour of 9:00 a.m., our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the stand and stated how thankful we ought to be for what the Lord has done for us. He said, if you have the Holy Ghost baptism, you really have something to be thankful for. STANDING ITEMS

Item 1. Item 14 of our 1975 Minutes is reprinted, without the preamble, as follows:

Sardis Association

September 13, 1975

of Old Regular Baptist

Dingess, West Virginia

Brethren:

In answer to the Query from the Dix Fork Church asking, "Does the Sardis Association believe in Sisters wearing pants, slacks or shorts?" We, as an Advisory body, say:

To answer this query in the affirmative would be interpreted by some Brethren too liberally and they would say we have laid down the gate and opened the doors to anything and everything.

To answer this Query in the negative would be interpreted by some Brethren too strictly and they would say we have shut the door on everything and Committees would flow from Church to Church like water. We believe the Sardis Association should advise the Churches to advise their members, both Brethren and Sisters, to dress soberly and modestly and to conduct themselves in a manner that becometh a Child of God. We believe that each Child of God will adorn themselves in a manner that they can easily be identified from the world. We feel the Bible, the infallible Word of God, sets forth and the Spirit will teach us how we should dress and conduct ourselves.

We believe, and the Association has so stated in the past, that each Church in the Sardis Association holds the key to its own door and is the sole judge of the conduct of its members as long as they follow the orthodox principles of religion and keep up a Godly discipline according to the rules of the Gospel as laid down in the Scriptures. In fact, Article 3 of our Constitution guarantees that the Association shall not infringe on any internal right of the Churches.

- Item 2. The Association, by regular move and second, said that if a Sister has cut her hair, she should be asked to let it grow out; if she fails to do so and cuts her hair again, she will be excluded.
- Item 3. It is ordered that we advise our Ministers of our Churches not to marry anyone having a living husband or wife unless they bring scripture evidence for putting their husband or wife away. (1929 minute)
- Item 4. It is ordered that we advise our Churches not to allow their Ministers to preach with any Minister who has two living women. (1919 minute)
- Item 5. It is ordered that requests for Union, Communion and Memorial meetings be published in our Minutes.

Item 6. By motion and second, it is ordered that Obituaries of our deceased Brethren and Sisters that are in good standing with the Churches at the time of death be printed in our Minutes. Also, friends of the Churches that are recommended by the Churches be printed in a separate section of our minute. These are to be presented to the Clerk at the end of the Association. A charge of \$15.00 will be made for a picture with the obituary, except that pictures of an Elder or his wife will continue to be printed free.

Clerks Note: Please note the above order - it is incumbent upon the churches in the Sardis Association that they be the screen and recommending body of Obituaries of Friends to be printed in our minutes and identify the same (by note or otherwise) to the Clerks when the Obituary is turned in. Each Church Moderator is further required to screen and approve any Obituary of a Friend of the Church and to reject any Obituary that has language that is offensive to the Sardis Association.

Item 7. "We the Sardis Association, advise our Sister Churches that it is not our practice to use sisters or double-married men in any function of the ministry, including leading prayer, in any of our Church services."

Item 8. By regular move and second, it is ordered that Item (15) of our 1999 Minute be reprinted as follows:

"It is a sin for anyone to put away their wife or husband for any cause except for fornication and marry another. In regards to going behind one's experience or receiving one in the Church with more than one living companion, we say that each Church shall be the sole judge to the validity of one's experience. Churches should not be forced to receive members, however, that would destroy the body. (Receive should be interpreted to include all means of receiving members.)"

SUNDAY

September 10, 2006

About the hour of 10:00 a.m. our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the stand to announce the arrangements, after much glorifying of God whose Spirit was so strong as some of the old time songs rang out from the large congregation gathered this morning. God has given these gifts to men. The Spirit of God searches all things, even the deep things of the heart. Old men will dream dreams and young men will prophesy. Bring all tithes into the storehouse, God will open the doors of Heaven and pour out on you a blessing. God, you have done great things for me. In the eyes of the Lord we are naked. It takes the Spirit of God to cover you all over. Make your peace calling and election sure, for with the heart man believes unto righteousness and with the mouth confession unto salvation. Today is the day of salvation, harden not your heart. In my fathers house are many blessings. You need to get a little blessing here. The Father, Son and Holy Ghost are right here now. The man of Galilee will take us by the hand and lead us. He preached from Psalms 23. Oh Children, if God be for you, who can be against you? Cease not to pray, in everything give thanks. He establishes my going. He led me in a path I had never known before. The last shall be first and the first shall be last. Fear not little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the Kingdom. I am thankful for feeling what I have felt down in my heart. The feeling here is so good. Add to your faith virtue, and to virtue knowledge. Call upon the Lord when all is well with you. Don't wait until you get in trouble.

Elder Jimmy Dale Sanders, of the Union Association, came forth declaring that we are supposed to read and to study to show ourselves approved. In order to be blessed by God, you need to have that Spirit from Heaven. The Bible tells us to read and study the Scriptures. As a young preacher you have to be blessed by the Spirit. We need the Spirit to preach. As we get a little older we lose a little of our memory. Sometimes we can't think of the Scriptures. We are not expected to remember everything. We must trust in the Lord. The Spirit is feeling, it has power. It touches your heart. The Gospel is the power of God. We can feel the Spirit. When it comes to preaching there is no foolishness. You must come to Christ. We must give Jesus and God the honor. I thought of the scripture: Mark 1:15, "the time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye, and believe the gospel." There is a real sound that comes from Heaven that connects with us. Listen for that sound. When you come in contact with it, you will know it. Some sounds stir up the flesh. There was a people in a land that God brought them out to a land that flowed with milk and honey. I came here not wanting praise, but I want that feeling that I am on the King's highway. God sent Moses to bring his people out. They wanted liberty and all we want is liberty. Moses lifted up his rod and stretched his hand over the sea. God dried up the sea. God made a way for us. When Israel went across Pharaoh tried to follow and the wheels fell off the chariots. God deserves credit for all things. We should not boast. When we have done all that we can, God will come in. Remember, when you did all you was able to do, God picked you up and put you on the Rock. Now we can sing a song that we could not sing before. The church is a royal priesthood, a royal nation. She is beautiful today. When in trouble God showed me the Old Baptist Church.

Don't brag about what you have. We must say, Lord here I am. We have no cloak for our sins. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." Jesus came to his own and his own received him not. We are in the Fathers hand today. It is essential to be born again and we preach a resurrection of the body. We ought to tell the Lord how much we love him. He will be unto us a God and we unto him children. People don't realize what the officers of the associations go through. Some are here for two days and cast their lots and are not seen anymore, but some of us are here all year long.

Brothers, I am honored to be here. I love to be among God's people. We should respect all our associations. We should treat all people the same, do not favor one brother over another. We don't need to tell the Lord what is going on, he knows what is going on. When we get to Heaven there will not be one who doesn't want to be there. I believe in the resurrection. Jesus said if a man come after me he must deny himself and follow me. The old man must be cast out and cannot get back in anymore. He can cause you trouble but he cannot get back in. We are walking by faith now. I love the Lord this morning. God only has one Church. He is married to only one woman. All the children wanted to do was to get in that new land and feel free. That is all we want today.

Elder Hobart Hamilton came to the stand praising God and stating how wonderful it has been since we gathered here Thursday night and how we have gotten along. God's people are a happy people. There is a better place to go to. Prayer is the greatest weapon God left us on earth. A long time ago when I was in sin I was going contrary to everything I had been taught. If you pray from the heart you will get an answer from Heaven. God touched my heart and let me know there was a better land to go to. If you want God in your heart you will have to pray. God is the best thing that happened to me. The Lord came to Cornelius in a vision and said thy prayers and thine alms are come up for a memorial before God. Cornelius sent three men to get Peter. If God calls you to preach and someone calls you at 2:00 o'clock in the morning, you need to go. Peter went upon the house top to pray and a great sheet with four corners full of four footed beast of the earth and wild beast and creeping things and fouls of the air came down and there came a voice to him telling him to rise, kill and eat. He said, "not so Lord, I have never eaten anything that is common or unclean." God said, "what God hath cleansed that call not thou common." Jesus came and died for us. Seek the Kingdom of God and all things will be added. The spirit told Peter to go down and doubt nothing. Peter said unto the three men why do ye seek me. They told Peter Cornelius's dream. The hardest thing I had to do was to deny self. I had to ask God to save my soul and let me live with him forever. You need to give your soul to Jesus Christ. You, as Old Regular Baptist, need to represent your Church well. Peter left with the three men and went to Cornelius's house. Cornelius told Peter his experience and Peter said, "I perceive that God is no respector of person." Jesus was preached to Cornelius and Peter commanded them to be baptized. God commanded men everywhere to repent.

Elder Thomas J. Dials, our Moderator, came to the stand to close out this One Hundred Fourteenth Sardis Old Regular Baptist Association stating Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. You must believe from the heart. There is only one way to Heaven and that is through Jesus Christ. God was going to deliver Israel out of bondage. God has a plan and we cannot change that plan. A baby was to be born in Egypt. Pharaoh ordered that every son that is born you shall cast in the river hoping to kill Moses. God put a love in Moses' mothers heart. She prepared a little ark. She put love in that ark. She wanted to make sure the baby would survive. Now we see someone out of the worldly kingdom find the baby. I am glad, of the sound we have heard today. The Lord goes before his people and they hear his voice. Pharaoh's daughter found the child and love was there. Give God all the credit if you have felt good today. Another baby was born, conceived of the Holy Ghost, a Lamb without spot or blemish. This Church rest upon Jesus. Peter was shown that the gentile people were coming in. There was no room in the inn for the Lord; he came in the most humble way.

This Association went well, but we have to do everything in God.

We need to be up and about our Father's business. This baby, hanging on the cross, never did anything. They took him down from the cross and he brought in a new way. God and Jesus have power greater than all natural kingdoms. On the third and appointed day the baby had arisen and that same baby has ascended back to God; but he remembers us today and watches over all of us. There is something that lingers before us and that is death. It does not make any difference what I look like, I just want to get to Heaven. This baby is coming again and he is going to take us home.


I would like to take this opportunity to pay honor to my father-in-law. All of his friends called him Steve or Junior, but I called him Pop.

Many times Pop, Granny, and I would sit and talk about the Lord and discuss scriptures. He would

always try to answer any questions I asked him regarding scriptures.




ALEY WILLIAMSON

Surviving are six sons: George E. Williamson of Hardy, KY;





CONSTITUTION OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experiences we, the OLD REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST, being baptized upon a profession of faith in Christ are convinced of the necessity of a combination of Churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion among us and to keep the order and rules of an Association according to the following plan of government.

- **ARTICLE 1.** The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different Churches in our union and sent to represent them in the Association and, upon their producing Letters from their respective Churches certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat.
- **ARTICLE 2**. In the Letters shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those baptized, received by Letter, dismissed, excluded, and deceased since our last Association.
- **ARTICLE 3.** The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord anything over God's heritage nor shall they have any clerical power over the Churches nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any Church in the Union.
- **ARTICLE 4.** The Association when convened shall be ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- **ARTICLE 5.** The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.
- **ARTICLE 6.** New Churches may be admitted to this union who shall petition by Letter and delegates and, if found upon examination to be orthodox and orderly, shall be received; and every Church in the union shall be entitled to a representative in the Association.
- **ARTICLE 7**. Every query presented by the Church to the Association, being first debated in their own Churches, shall be taken up by the Association.
- **ARTICLE 8.** Every motion made and seconded shall come under consideration of the Association, except when withdrawn by the one who made it.
- **ARTICLE 9**. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the Churches with Minutes of the Association.
- **ARTICLE 10.** We think it necessary that we should have an Association Fund for defraying the expenses of the same. We think it the duty of each Church in the union to contribute such sums as they think proper and to send it by their delegates to the Association; and such sums be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer chosen by the Association who shall be accountable for the money paid him by the Association, and paid out according to the Association.
- **ARTICLE 11**. There shall be an Association book kept wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be recorded by a Secretary appointed by the Association who shall receive a compensation for his services.
- **ARTICLE 12**. The minutes of the Association shall be read, and corrected if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises, unless the same is dispensed with.
- **ARTICLE 13.** Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made by a majority of the union, if deemed necessary.
- **ARTICLE 14.** All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by the will of the majority of the delegates present.

ARTICLE 15. The Association shall have the power to provide for the general union of the Churches; to preserve inviolable a chain of communion among the Churches; to give Churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; to inquire into the cause of the Churches failing to represent themselves at any time in the Association; to appropriate the money contributed by the Churches for the Association fund to any purpose they may think proper; to appoint any member, by their consent, to transact any business which they see necessary; and they shall have the power to withdraw from any Church in the union which violates the rules of the Association or deviate from the orthodox principles of religion; and to admit any orderly Minister of our order to seat with us. The Association shall have the right to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think most convenient to the Churches.

ARTICLES OF FAITH OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

- **ARTICLE 1.** We believe in only one true and living God; the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost; and these three are one, equal in power, essence and glory.
- **ARTICLE 2.** We believe the scripture of the Old and New Testaments of the Authorized King James Version of the Bible are the written words of God and are the only rules of faith and practice.
- ARTICLE 3. We believe in the doctrine of election by grace, for by grace are ye saved through faith.
- **ARTICLE 4.** We believe in the doctrine of original sin and of man's inability to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature, therefore the Saviour is needed for our redemption.
- **ARTICLE 5.** We believe that sinners are called to repentance and believe in the Gospel and regeneration of the soul and sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, and none shall fall away and be lost.
- **ARTICLE 6.** We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.
- **ARTICLE** 7. We believe that baptism is the ordinance of God's Church on earth and the mode IMMERSION, back foremost, so as to cover all over.
- **ARTICLE 8.** We believe that the Lord's Supper is the command of the Saviour, and that by use of bread and the fruit of the vine, and feet washing should be kept up until his second coming by his believers.
- **ARTICLE 9.** We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal.
- **ARTICLE 10**. We believe that no Minister has the right to administer the ordinances and commands of the Gospel except such as are regularly ordained and baptized, and that by immersion by a legal administrator of the Gospel comes under the hands of a regularly chosen presbytery of the Church.
- **ARTICLE 11**. We believe it to be the duty of all Church members to contribute for defraying all reasonable expenses of the Church, never forgetting the poor according to their several abilities.
- **ARTICLE 12.** We believe that every doctrine that goes to encourage or indulge people in their sins or cause them to settle down on anything short of saving faith in Christ for salvation is erroneous, and such doctrine shall be rejected by us.
- **ARTICLE 13.** We believe that the Church of Jesus Christ is a congregation of faithful believers in Christ who have obtained fellowship with the Lord and one another, and have given themselves to the Lord and have agreed to keep up a Godly discipline according to the rules of the Gospel.
- **ARTICLE 14.** We believe that Jesus Christ is the head of the Church and the government thereof is upon His Shoulders.

ARTICLE 15. We believe that a sanctioned marriage of God is between a man and a woman only. Also, we believe in receiving members into our fellowship that follow the natural dating relationship that leads to holy matrimony between a man and a woman only: thereby, preserving the family unit of father, mother and children. Ephesians 5:22,23 and 28, St. Mark 10:6,7,8 and Romans 1:26 and 27.

ARTICLE 16. None of the above Articles shall be considered as to hold with particular election and reprobation so as to make God partial, directly or indirectly, nor to injure any of the children of men, nor shall any of those Articles be altered without legal notice and free consent.

RULES OF DECORUM OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

- ARTICLE 1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- **ARTICLE 2**. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.
- **ARTICLE 3**. Only one member shall speak at a time who shall arise from his seat and obtain consent from the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.
- **ARTICLE 4**. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone except the Moderator until he is through.
- **ARTICLE 5.** He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who has spoken so as make remarks on his slips or imperfections, but shall fairly state the cause as nearly as he can so as to convey his ideas.
- ARTICLE 6. No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association without leave of the Association.
- **ARTICLE 7**. No person shall speak more than three times on any subject without leave of the Association, and only five minutes at a time.
- **ARTICLE 8.** No person shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same nor whisper in time of public speech.
- **ARTICLE 9**. No member of the Association shall address another in any other term or appellation than that of "brother."
- **ARTICLE 10**. The Moderator shall not interrupt or prohibit any member from speaking until he gives his light on any subject unless he violates the Rules of Decorum.
- **ARTICLE 11**. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called as often as the Association requires.

- ARTICLE 12. The Moderator shall have the same right of speech as any other member, provided the chair be filled; and he shall have no right to vote unless the Association be equally divided, then he may give the deciding vote.
- **ARTICLE 13**. Any member who shall willingly and knowingly violate any of the Decorum shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.
