PROCEEDINGS of the ONE HUNDRED AND EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL SESSION of the SARDIS ASSOCIATION OF OLD REGULAR BAPTIST THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST

FRIDAY September 9, 2011

The Sardis Association of Old Regular Baptist, the Church of Jesus Christ, assembled in the Busines Room of the Sardis Association Building at 180 Brushy School Road, Varney, Pike County, Kentucky, we our host, the Pilgrims Home Church and co-host Churches: Apple Orchard, Bent Branch, Turkey Creek and Little Tayle, on Friday before the second Saturday in September, 2011.

About the hour of 9:00 a.m. our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the Stand and welcomed everyone. Brother Tom spoke as follows: What a great blessing it is to see the brothers and sisters. It is so important how we conduct ourselves. I want to get on the cloud of glory and go up and see God as Brother Clarence Mathis said, "we are not here to do our will or another man's will, but God our Father." The whole duty of man is to fear God. I need his strength. The steps of a righteous man are ordered of the Lord. We are not living to please man, but we are pleasing God to live.

Elder Jack Robinette, having been chosen as alternate for this session's Introductory Sermon, came to the stand to preach the opening of the service. The delegates having assembled themselves in order, Elder Thomas J. Dials, our Moderator, called to seats the delegates from our Churches sent to represent them in this Association and the delegates sent by our Corresponding Sister Associations. Brother Tommy called upon Elder Estill Hamilton of the Union Association, to open the Service.

Brother Estill preached as follows: I came here to embrace you and to show you my love. Everyone should have come looking up to God. The Lord is looking down upon us at all times. He came to his own and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God. He chose me out of this world and I am no more of this world. I believe in a real resurrection, today. We need to praise the Lord with all our soul, mind and strength. Let everyone come unto me. Let everything that breaths the breath of life praise the Lord. When I get in trouble I call upon the Lord. I have a King that can lift me up no matter how low I get. He spoke to the sea and it became calm. He wore a crown of thorns. They pierced him in the side and forthwith came blood and water. My strength comes from God. Jesus came down to this earth. People love darkness more than light.

- (5) The Committee on Finance reported \$5,375.00 received from the Churches as reported in the Statistical Table and after turning this amount over to the Treasurer was discharged by regular move and second.
- (6) The Moderator appointed a Committee to arrange the preaching for Friday night and Saturday consisting of one delegate from each Church in the Sardis Association, and the entire delegation from the host church.
- (7) The Moderator appointed the following Committee of Tellers to take the vote of the Sardis Association delegates for Officers to serve the Sardis Association for the coming year and instructed the delegates to vote for a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk:

Elder Sam Fry, Moderator of the Bride of Christ Church located at Lavalette, WV, came forth and was allowed to speak. After brief questioning, by regular move and second, their delegates were seated and their Letter of Request for Correspondence was referred to the committee on arrangements.
- (15) The Moderator appointed a Committee on Arrangements consisting of one delegate from each Church and all the Officers of the Sardis Association, along with the entire delegation from each of our Corresponding Sister Associations, to arrange the business from Saturday's session of the Sardis Association. By regular move and second this committee will meet at 2:00 p.m. today.

SATURDAY

September 10, 2011

Met pursuant to adjournment at the Sardis Association Building where, about the hour of 9:00 a.m., our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the stand stating that one more time I get the privilege to come before you. One day when the Lord comes back again he will deliver us to our Father. Jesus said, "My grace is sufficient for thee." Let his same spirit lead us the same as yesterday. We are not living to please man, but we are pleasing God to live.

He then called upon Elder Reuben Lycans, of the Old Indian Bottom Association, to open these services. He said, we are a blessed people today. We never know when we separate if we will ever meet again. We must wait for the power to come down. When we awake in his likeness, we will be satisfied. Run the race with patience that is set before you. I am glad to be a part of this family. It takes faith to please God.

And an highway shall be there, and a way, and it shall be called the way of holiness; the unclean shall not pass over it. This is the King's highway. I am glad God set me on this way. If you get in this way and it gets in you it will take you to Heaven. All the days of our appointed time we are waiting for the King to come, then we will be fully satisfied. We are looking for the great I Am. If we are doing things that we are ashamed for our children to see us do, we should not be doing them. If God has called you, you have to come God's way.

When God told Jonah to go to Nineveh he went to go to Joppa and he found a ship and paid his own fare. He got down in the bottom of the ship but could not hide from the Lord. When a great wind came they began to throw things off the ship. They begin to cast lots to see who was to blame and it fell on Jonah. Jonah said, I am an Hebrew and I fear God. When Jesus went into a ship with his disciples to go to the other side of the lake, as they sailed he fell asleep and there came down a storm of wind. They became afraid and came to Jesus. He calmed the wind. They picked Jonah up and threw him overboard. Jonah was in the belly of the whale three days and three nights but God raised him up. Brethren:

In answer to the Query from the Dix Fork Church asking, "Does the Sardis Association believe in Sister wearing pants, slacks or shorts?" We, as an Advisory body, say:

To answer this query in the affirmative would be interpreted by some Brethren too liberally and the would say we have laid down the gate and opened the doors to anything and everything.

To answer this Query in the negative would be interpreted by some Brethren too strictly and they would say we have shut the door on everything and Committees would flow from Church to Church like water. We believe the Sardis Association should advise the Churches to advise their members, both Brethren and Sisters to dress soberly and modestly and to conduct themselves in a manner that becometh a Child of God. We believe that each Child of God will adorn themselves in a manner that they can easily be identified from the world. We feel the Bible, the infallible Word of God, sets forth and the Spirit will teach us how we should dress and conduct ourselves.

We believe, and the Association has so stated in the past, that each Church in the Sardis Association holds the key to its own door and is the sole judge of the conduct of its members as long as they follow the orthodox principles of religion and keep up a Godly discipline according to the rules of the Gospel as laid down in the Scriptures. In fact, Article 3 of our Constitution guarantees that the Association shall not infringe on any internal right of the Churches.

- Item 2. The Association, by regular move and second, said that if a Sister has cut her hair, she should be asked to let it grow out; if she fails to do so and cuts her hair again, she will be excluded.

- **Item 4.** It is ordered that we advise our Churches not to allow their Ministers to preach with any Minister who has two living women. (1919 minute)
- **Item 5.** It is ordered that requests for Union, Communion and Memorial meetings be published in our Minutes.

Item 6. By motion and second, it is ordered that Obituaries of our deceased Brethren and Sisters that are model standing with the Churches at the time of death be printed in our Minutes. Also, friends of the hurches that are recommended by the Churches be printed in a separate section of our minute. These are to be presented to the Clerk at the end of the Association. A charge of \$15.00 will be made for a picture with the obituary, except that pictures of an Elder or his wife will continue to be printed free.

Clerks Note: Please note the above order - it is incumbent upon the churches in the Sardis Association that they be the screen and recommending body of Obituaries of Friends to be printed in our minutes and identify the same (by note or otherwise) to the Clerks when the Obituary is turned in. Each Church Moderator is further required to screen and approve any Obituary of a Friend of the Church and to reject any Obituary that has language that is offensive to the Sardis Association.

Item 7. "We the Sardis Association, advise our Sister Churches that it is not our practice to use sisters or double-married men in any function of the ministry, including leading prayer, in any of our Church services."

Item 8. By regular move and second, it is ordered that Item (15) of our 1999 Minute be reprinted as follows:

"It is a sin for anyone to put away their wife or husband for any cause except for fornication and marry another. In regards to going behind one's experience or receiving one in the Church with more than one living companion, we say that each Church shall be the sole judge to the validity of one's experience. Churches should not be forced to receive members, however, that would destroy the body. (Receive should be interpreted to include all means of receiving members.)"

SEPTEMBER 11, 2011

Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass or a tinkling cymbal and though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor and though I give my body to be burned and hath not charity, it profiteth me nothing.







CONSTITUTION OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experiences we, the OLD REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST.

The paptized upon a profession of faith in Christ are convinced of the necessity of a combination of the sin order to perpetuate a union and communion among us and to keep the order and rules of an exaction according to the following plan of government.

- RTICLE 1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different Churches in our mand sent to represent them in the Association and, upon their producing Letters from their respective arches certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat.
- **ARTICLE 2.** In the Letters shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those baptized, received by ...er, dismissed, excluded, and deceased since our last Association.
- ARTICLE 3. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord anything over God's critage nor shall they have any clerical power over the Churches nor shall they infringe on any of the internal costs of any Church in the Union.
- **ARTICLE 4.** The Association when convened shall be ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- **ARTICLE 5.** The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk each mosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.
- **ARTICLE 6.** New Churches may be admitted to this union who shall petition by Letter and delegates and, round upon examination to be orthodox and orderly, shall be received; and every Church in the union shall re-entitled to a representative in the Association.
- ARTICLE 7. Every query presented by the Church to the Association, being first debated in their own burches, shall be taken up by the Association.
- **ARTICLE 8.** Every motion made and seconded shall come under consideration of the Association, except shen withdrawn by the one who made it.
- **ARTICLE 9.** The Association shall endeavor to furnish the Churches with Minutes of the Association.
- ARTICLE 10. We think it necessary that we should have an Association Fund for defraying the expenses of the same. We think it the duty of each Church in the union to contribute such sums as they think proper and to send it by their delegates to the Association; and such sums be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer chosen by the Association who shall be accountable for the money paid him by the Association, and paid out according to the Association.
- ARTICLE 11. There shall be an Association book kept wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be recorded by a Secretary appointed by the Association who shall receive a compensation for his services.
- ARTICLE 12. The minutes of the Association shall be read, and corrected if need be, and signed by the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk before the Association rises, unless the same is dispensed with.
- **ARTICLE 13.** Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made by a majority of the union, if deemed necessary.
- **ARTICLE 14.** All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by the will of the majority of the delegates present.

ARTICLE 15. The Association shall have the power to provide for the general union of the Churches; to preserve inviolable a chain of communion among the Churches; to give Churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; to inquire into the cause of the Churches failing to represent themselves at any time in the Association; to appropriate the money contributed by the Churches for the Association fund to any purpose they may think proper; to appoint any member, by their consent, to transact any business which they see necessary; and they shall have the power to withdraw from any Church in the union which violates the rules of the Association or deviate from the orthodox principles of religion; and to admit any orderly Minister of our order to seat with us. The Association shall have the right to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think most convenient to the Churches.

ARTICLES OF FAITH OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

- **ARTICLE 1**. We believe in only one true and living God; the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost; and these three are one, equal in power, essence and glory.
- **ARTICLE 2**. We believe the scripture of the Old and New Testaments of the Authorized King James Version of the Bible are the written words of God and are the only rules of faith and practice.
- **ARTICLE 3**. We believe in the doctrine of election by grace, for by grace are ye saved through faith.
- **ARTICLE 4**. We believe in the doctrine of original sin and of man's inability to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature, therefore the Saviour is needed for our redemption.
- **ARTICLE 5**. We believe that sinners are called to repentance and believe in the Gospel and regeneration of the soul and sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, and none shall fall away and be lost.
- **ARTICLE 6**. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.
- **ARTICLE 7**. We believe that baptism is the ordinance of God's Church on earth and the mode IMMERSION, back foremost, so as to cover all over.
- **ARTICLE 8**. We believe that the Lord's Supper is the command of the Saviour, and that by use of bread and the fruit of the vine, and feet washing should be kept up until his second coming by his believers.
- **ARTICLE 9**. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal.
- **ARTICLE 10.** We believe that no Minister has the right to administer the ordinances and commands of the Gospel except such as are regularly baptized by immersion of a legal administrator of the Gospel and ordained coming under the hands of a regularly chosen presbytery of the Church.
- **ARTICLE 11**. We believe it to be the duty of all Church members to contribute for defraying all reasonable expenses of the Church, never forgetting the poor according to their several abilities.
- ARTICLE 12. We believe that every doctrine that goes to encourage or indulge people in their sins or cause them to settle down on anything short of saving faith in Christ for salvation is erroneous, and such doctrine shall be rejected by us.
- **ARTICLE 13**. We believe that the Church of Jesus Christ is a congregation of faithful believers in Christ who have obtained fellowship with the Lord and one another, and have given themselves to the Lord and have agreed to keep up a Godly discipline according to the rules of the Gospel.
- **ARTICLE 14**. We believe that Jesus Christ is the head of the Church and the government thereof is upon His Shoulders.

- ARTICLE 15. We believe that a sanctioned marriage of God is between a man and a woman only. Also, seve in receiving members into our fellowship that follow the natural dating relationship that leads to matrimony between a man and a woman only: thereby, preserving the family unit of father, mother and mem. Ephesians 5:22,23 and 28, St. Mark 10:6,7,8 and Romans 1:26 and 27.
- ARTICLE 16. None of the above Articles shall be considered as to hold with particular election and nation so as to make God partial, directly or indirectly, nor to injure any of the children of men, nor any of those Articles be altered without legal notice and free consent.

RULES OF DECORUM OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

- **ARTICLE 1.** The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- **ARTICLE 2.** The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator. Clerk and Assistant Clerk each sen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.
- **ARTICLE 3.** Only one member shall speak at a time who shall arise from his seat and obtain consent from a Moderator when he is about to make his speech.
- **ARTICLE 4.** The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone except the derator until he is through.
- **ARTICLE 5.** He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who has spoken as make remarks on his slips or imperfections, but shall fairly state the cause as nearly as he can so as convey his ideas.
- **ARTICLE 6.** No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association without leave of the Association.
- **ARTICLE 7.** No person shall speak more than three times on any subject without leave of the Association, and only five minutes at a time.
- **ARTICLE 8.** No person shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same nor whisper in time i public speech.
- **ARTICLE 9.** No member of the Association shall address another in any other term or appellation than that of "brother."
- **ARTICLE 10**. The Moderator shall not interrupt or prohibit any member from speaking until he gives his aght on any subject unless he violates the Rules of Decorum.
- **ARTICLE 11**. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called as often as the Association requires.
- **ARTICLE 12**. The Moderator shall have the same right of speech as any other member, provided the chair be filled; and he shall have no right to vote unless the Association be equally divided, then he may give the deciding vote.
- **ARTICLE 13**. Any member who shall willingly and knowingly violate any of the Decorum shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.
